
## The Sermon on the Mount

Fasting

Home Fellowship Group Bible Study Questions
Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup>/Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> November 2013

- 1) Our passage begins with the word 'and'. Does this imply a direct connection with the theme of the previous passage and if so, are there other scriptures to back this up?
- 2) As in both previous themes in the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus introduces His teaching with the words: 'when' rather than 'if'. What would His Jewish listeners understand about the requirements of fasting?
- 3) In verses 16-17 Jesus contrasts two different approaches to fasting. What does this teach us about the subject?

The final two questions explore whether fasting is relevant today for the Christian.

- 4) Does the New Testament teach us that we should continue to fast today?
- 5) What would be our reasons and occasions for fasting today?
