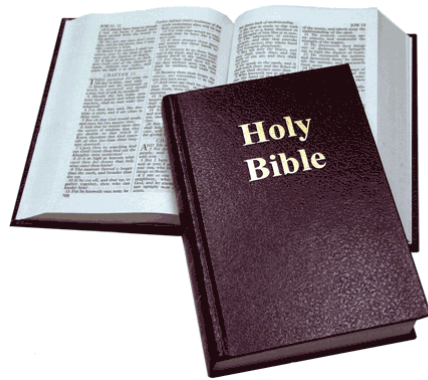


# The Sermon on the Mount

- 1) How does Jesus' warning at the beginning of verse 15 link into what He has been teaching in the previous few verses?
- 2) What do false teachers look like; and what is the point that Jesus is making here?
- 3) What does Jesus mean when He says that we can recognise false teachers by their fruit?
- 4) When Jesus talks about a healthy tree and a diseased tree, what characteristics of the false teacher is He illustrating?
- 5) Verse 19 suggests a very drastic response. What is Jesus describing here?
- 6) Whilst majoring on the problem of false teachers, there are nevertheless lessons we can learn about true discipleship. *What practical steps can we take to become those who are producing good fruit in our lives as Christians?*
