

Measuring sin in degrees

Each of the next six blocks of verses follows the same pattern which goes something along the lines of: "You have heard it said...but I say to you".

- 1) The two 'sins' in verses 21 and 22 seem to be a strange contrast; bearing in mind the degree of seriousness between the two. What general point do you think Jesus is making here that is not specifically about murder or anger?
- 2) In verse 23 Jesus places the emphasis on our attitude. Why do you think Jesus uses 'giving at the altar' as an example?
- 3) Look again at verses 23-24. At first glance the matter seems to be stated the wrong way round. What is Jesus saying here and why does He tell us to leave <u>our</u> offering before the altar?
- 4) In what ways does the instruction of verses 23-24 rub against the grain. How does it fit with what we have previously discovered in the Beatitudes?
- 5) For some of us, personal experience will reveal that it is not always possible to effect reconciliation. *How are we to deal with this?*
- 6) Verses 25-26 seem to step things up a further notch. *What is Jesus telling us here?*
