
Joshua – The man and the message

In this study we pick up the story with the Israelites so close to the Promised Land that it can be surveyed from the top of a mountain. Although Moses will not be allowed to enter Canaan, he is able to view it from a distance; and his prayer is that God would raise up a new leader "so that the congregation of the LORD may not be as sheep that have no shepherd" (Numbers 27:17).

- 1) In verses 18-19, why was Joshua's commissioning to be such a public event; and why is Eleazar mentioned separately?
- 2) What is the significance of verse 20 in Joshua's continuing preparation for leadership. What does this teach about leadership in the church today?
- 3) What do we discover in verse 21 that arguably identifies the most important part of Joshua's training?

Read: Numbers 27:22-23/Deuteronomy 31:7-8

- 4) What does verse 7 remind you of; and what does it suggest about the task, and the person called to perform it?
- 5) Following the <u>exhortation</u> in verse 7, we find the <u>encouragement</u> in verse 8. What are the reasons that Joshua does not need to "fear or be dismayed"?
- 6) What does the call and commissioning of a leader thousands of years ago teach us about the call to leadership among God's people today?
